

West Indies Stars To Face Off At Global T20 Canada

Darren Sammy, Chris Gayle, Steve Smith, David Warner, Andre Russell In Six Teams Of Cricket League

TORONTO _ West Indies stars Darren Sammy and Chris Gayle will face off on the opening day of the Global T20 Canada schedule.

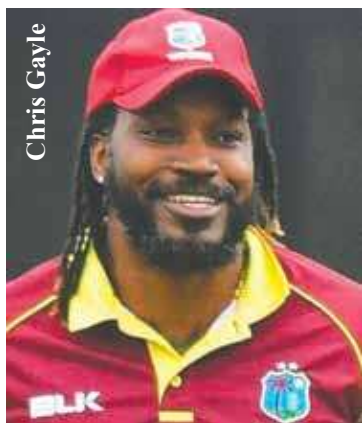
Sammy's Toronto Nationals, which includes disgraced former Australian skipper Steve Smith, will meet Gayle's Vancouver Knights on June 28 in the opening match of the inaugural 22-game season of the Twenty20 cricket league. The Knights also has West Indian Andre Russell.

Smith will take on countryman David Warner on July 2 when Toronto takes on the Winnipeg Hawks. Smith and Warner have been banned by Cricket Australia for a year for their involvement in a high-profile ball-tampering scandal in South Africa in March.

Along with Cameron Bancroft, who was suspended for nine months, the two are banned from international and domestic cricket in Australia but can still play club cricket elsewhere.

Global T20 Canada features six teams: Toronto and Vancouver are joined by the Montreal Tigers, Edmonton Royals, Winnipeg Hawks and a Cricket West Indies representative B team.

The five Canadian teams are a

deal with Cricket Canada to stage the event. The T20 game is a faster, more action-packed version of cricket with each team batting for just 20 overs.

Organizers say information on tickets and broadcast partners will be announced later this week.

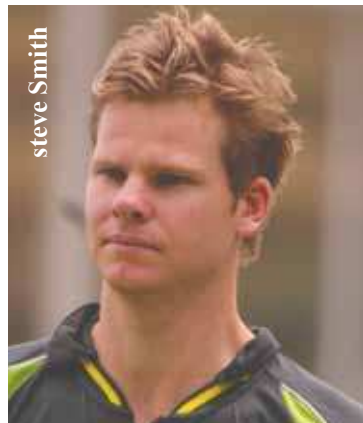

Toronto National has selected off spinner Nikhil Dutta in the first Global T20 Canada Players Draft conducted Sunday, marking a landmark moment for the sport of cricket in Canada.

Dutta, a member of Canada's men's national team, was selected in the seventh round for a \$25,000 salary, confirming the 23-year old's reputation as Canada's top player. "I feel honoured to be drafted in Global T20 Canada and excited to be playing with all the coveted players from international cricket," said Dutta, a Toronto native. "This tournament will provide great exposure for Canadian cricket and give opportunities for our players to play with the big players."

Suits Filed Against BMO, CIBC For Data Breaches

TORONTO _ Proposed class-action lawsuits have been filed against Bank of Montreal and CIBC's direct banking division Simplii Financial over recently disclosed cybersecurity breaches impacting up to 90,000 customers.

Law firms Siskinds LLP and JSS Barristers say they have filed the proposed class actions against the two Canadian banks in the Ontario Superior Court of Justice, alleging the institutions failed to establish robust security measures to protect clients' sensitive information.

The data breaches have had far reaching implications on clients' personal lives and financial affairs, the full extent of which has yet to be determined, said Sajjad Nematollahi, a lawyer with Siskinds.

"Financial institutions like CIBC and BMO are entrusted with their clients' most sensitive personal information, and are expected to have in place robust security measures to safeguard that information against unauthorized access, use or theft," he said in a statement.

"Canadian financial institutions are required and expected to continuously review their defence systems and use best industry practices to protect Canadians' personal and financial information."

A CIBC spokesman said Monday: "While we will vigorously defend Simplii's legal position at the appropriate time and in the appropriate venue, our focus is on protecting and supporting our clients."

BMO did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

Simplii and BMO warned in May that "fraudsters" may have accessed certain personal and financial information of some of its customers, up to 40,000 clients and 50,000 clients, respectively.

Both institutions said they had been contacted by entities claiming to have accessed their client's personal data. A BMO spokesman said a threat was made to make the information public. BMO and CIBC have since offered clients free credit monitoring and have pledged to cover any money lost due to fraud. The proposed class action lawsuits, which have not yet been certified, are seeking general, compensatory, consequential and punitive damages.

Each team will play the five other sides in the first round June 28 to July 8. The second round, July 10-11, will see the No. 1 team versus No. 6, No. 2 versus No. 5 and No. 3 versus No. 4.

The bottom two teams in the standings will drop out. The July 12-15 playoffs will see No. 1 versus No. 2 with the winner moving straight into the final. The loser will play the winner of the match between the No. 3 and 4 teams.

All the matches will take place at the Maple Leaf Cricket Club in King City, north of Toronto.

Global T20 Canada is the brainchild of the Mercuri Group, an Indian company that struck a
