# These Deaths Will Not Go In Vain - PM Modi

could have been a suicide attack. In a statement to a local news agency GNS, a caller claiming to be a spokesman of JeM said it was a 'fidayeen' (suicide) attack.

All the injured were shifted to the Army's 92 Base Hospital in the Badamibagh cantonment of Srinagar city. Some of them were in critical condition.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi led the nation in condemning the horror. "The attack ... is despicable. I strongly condemn this dastardly attack. The sacrifices of our brave security personnel shall not go in vain. The entire nation stands shoulder to shoulder with the families of the brave martyrs," he tweeted.

Home Minister Rajnath Singh, who was to visit Bihar on Friday, is set to reach Srinagar instead. Home Secretary Rajiv Gauba cut short his visit to Bhutan to rush to Srinagar for a high-level security meeting on Friday.

"Today's dastardly attack ... is extremely painful and disturbing. I bow to each and every CRPF jawan who has sacrificed his life in service to the nation," Rajnath Singh said. An officer said the

CRPF and police would carry out a detailed investigation to understand the circumstances in which the attack took place.

This is the worst single attack in Jammu and Kashmir since a nascent Pakistan-backed separatist campaign began in 1989. It is also the worst attack carried out by militants after the one on the Uri Army camp on September 18, 2016 left 19 soldiers dead -- forcing New Delhi to launch 'surgi-

cal strikes' on terrorist camps in Pakistan.

Officials said the reason why so many CRPF personnel were on the move at one go was because the Srinagar-Jammu highway had been shut the past two days due to bad weather. The convoy left Jammu before dawn.

Former Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah condemned "in the strongest possible terms" the killing of CRPF

troopers and blasted central Minister Jitendra Singh for "playing politics" over the bloodbath. "I condemn this attack in the strongest possible terms. My prayers for the injured and condolences to the families of the bereaved."

Jitendra Singh in a tweet called "to question those who while living in India describing themselves as mainstream Kashmir politicians tend to be apologetic about these terror activities"


# Ontario Ministries Directed To Limit Spending

ment had already identified \$3.2 billion in savings as was previously detailed in the 2018 Fall Economic Statement.

As a result, even after returning \$2.7 billion to the taxpayers, Ontario's deficit had declined by \$500 million. When combined with the improved revenue numbers, the new projections confirm that, the Ford Government had already reduced Ontario's inherited deficit by \$1.5 billion to date.

The ministers revealed that the government is continuing to take steps to control unnecessary expenses and provide the people with certainty that their tax dollars are being treated with

respect. To that end, the government has directed all ministries to limit spending to commitments under contract, legislation and/or

requirements to fulfil core services up to March 31, 2019. Ministries are also directed to not enter into any new funding commitments, including spending from within their allocation, unless the ministry has sought and received specific direction to do so from the Treasury Board.

"We are taking steps to curb the kind of new spending that governments sometimes see towards the end of their fiscal years — what we call March Madness," said Bethlenfalvy.

- The 2018-19 revenue outlook is projected to be \$149.2 billion, or \$1 billion higher than forecast in the 2018 Fall Economic Statement. The increase is due to higher Harmonized Sales Tax and Corporate Income Tax revenue.

- The outlook for total expenses in 2018-19 is \$161.8 billion, an increase of approximately \$4 million compared to the 2018 Fall Economic Statement.

- The Province's interest on debt expense forecast, at \$12.5 billion, is unchanged from the 2018 Fall Statement.

- Ontario's real GDP increased by 0.6 per cent in the third quarter of 2018.

- The report of the Independent Financial Commission of Inquiry was released on September 21, 2018, and found that Ontario's deficit was \$15 billion.

## Ambani Tops Hurun India Philanthropy List 2018

NEW DELHI: Reliance Industries Ltd (RIL) Chairman Mukesh Ambani topped the Hurun India Philanthropy List 2018, released on Saturday, with the highest contribution of Rs 437 crore between October 2017 and September 2018.

Ambani was followed by Piramal Group Chairman Ajay Piramal who made Rs 200 crore donations during the period.

The list, compiled by the Hurun Research Institute, ranks individuals from India who donated Rs 10 crore and above between October 1, 2017 and September 30, 2018. The total Indian philanthropy amount in the list stands at Rs 1,560 crore. The list included 39 Indians.

It showed that education was the most preferred cause for donations, followed by healthcare and rural development.

Ambani was also named the richest Indian by Barclays Hurun India Rich List for 2018, with a net worth of Rs 3.71 lakh crore (approx. US\$45 billion).
